VA Veteran Experience Office

Community engagement by independent, communitybased organizations that are comprised of a collaborative network of Veterans, advocates, resources, and other stakeholders who organize in the local community to improve outcomes for Veterans, those currently serving, and their communities to create 'Veteran-friendly Communities'.



National Veteran Intermediary

National Veterans Intermediary is for communities that collaborate or want to collaborate more effectively to serve all military, veterans, their families and caregivers across the country. Communities collaborating to support veterans come in all shapes and sizes.



Building Healthy Military Communities

Building Healthy Military Communities (BHMC) is a pilot initiative intended to improve mission readiness, health, and well-being of geographically dispersed persons currently serving and their families through increased awareness and access to military and community resources promoting well-being. To achieve this goal, we are seeking to leverage three interventions: state coordinators, a strategic information campaign, and mobile-health technologies.






BTYR Regional Convening Structure




